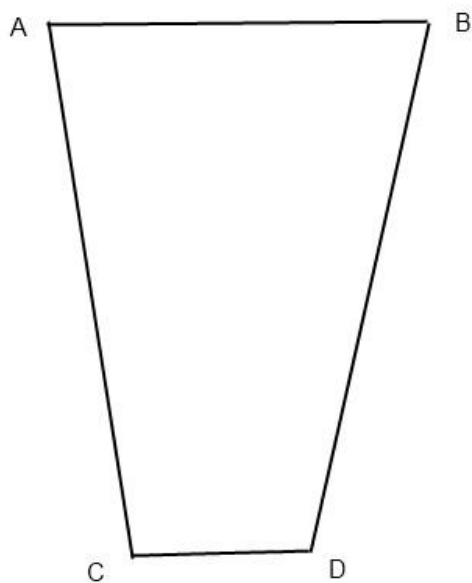

## Patterns



Line A-B = circumference of arm  
at bicep - 2 inches

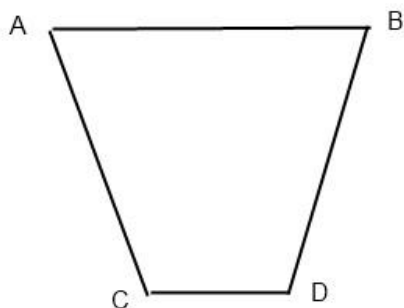
Line C-D = circumference of arm  
at wrist - 2 inches

Line A-C = length of arm  
from AB to CD

This pattern can be converted to closed sleeves  
by adding .25-.50 inches seam allowance to  
each measurement instead of subtracting 2  
inches.

*One-part Sleevelet*



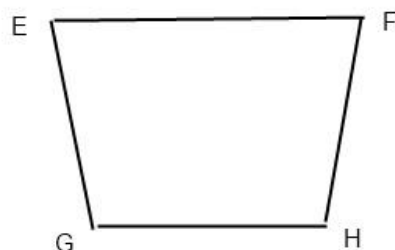


### Lower sleeve

Line A-B = circumference of arm  
below elbow - 2 inches

Line C-D = circumference of arm  
at wrist - 2 inches

Line AC = length of arm from AB to CD



### Upper sleeve

Line E-F = circumference of arm  
at bicep - 2 inches

Line G-H = circumference of arm  
above elbow - 2 inches

Line E-G = length of arm from EF to GH
